Takashimaya joins RE100 and EV100 to support a carbon-free future

Takashimaya (headquarters: Chuo-ku, Osaka City; president: Yoshio Murata) is pleased to announce that it has joined global initiatives RE100 and EV100, committing to source 100% of its energy from renewable sources and convert its entire fleet of vehicles to electric.

Since the Japan Climate Initiative (JCI) launched in July 2018, Takashimaya has engaged with JCI's mission to achieve a carbon-free future, taking actions such as installing LEDs in its stores and offices. In August 2019, the company joined Japan Climate Leaders' Partnership, a Japanese business coalition that focuses on the business benefits of the transition to a carbon-free economy. Now a member of RE100 and EV100, Takashimaya will make a further contribution toward a carbon-free future. Under RE100, the company commits to source 100% of its energy from renewable sources by 2050. Under EV100, it commits to convert its entire fleet of directly controlled vehicles to electric by 2030.
